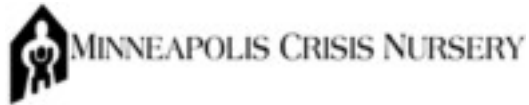


## KEEWAYDIN IN THE COMMUNITY



The Minneapolis Crisis Nursery needed more space. In 1994, it turned away more than 2,000 children whose parents sought temporary shelter for their children during a family crisis. While the need was overwhelming, the Nursery's staff and volunteer board felt unprepared.
